



McKeachie Residence Charleston, SC

The project included the interior renovations to a circa 1870 three-story wood frame Charleston single house located in the heart of the historic District. The work also included the construction of a new stair tower that was designed to look like an enclosed porch structure. Interior modifications included the renovation and alterations to the kitchens, baths, and bedroom areas on all three floors. The dining room was restored to its original configuration, and the street entry door and gate were reconstructed. This project was reviewed and received approval from the City Board of Architectural Review (BAR), and was included on the 1997 spring tour of homes held by the Historic Charleston Foundation.

Interior Design services included: new and existing furniture placement, custom window treatments, paint, wallcovering, selection and placement of artwork and accessories, and styling the home for the Preservation Society's Candlelight Tour of Homes.
